1. What lessons are your biggest takeaways from Sunday's message?
2. Describe the vision of Daniel and its fulfillment from what you learned last Sunday.
3. How does secular history line up with the fulfillment of the prophecy?
4. What do you think is the "little horn" described in the prophecy?
5. What is the significance of God's kingdom in the unfolding of history and salvation?

Pastor shared the following three points and he closed it with three challenges:

The 3 Points:

1. Culture is constantly shifting but God is unchanging.
2. Opposition to the Gospel increase but God's Church will keep growing.
3. Wickedness will increase but the Gospel keep spreading.

The 3 Challenges:

1. Follow God, not culture. (1 Thessalonians 5:23)
2. Be ready for Christ's return. (Matthew 24:42)
3. Make the most of this life. (Ephesians 5:15-17)

What part of the sermon do you find most interesting and challenging?

4. If God is concerned about the eternal destiny of every individual, how can we as God's kingdom, effectively bring more people with us to heaven?
